REGULAR MEETING MINUTES

A representative from Mothers Against Drunk Driving (M.A.D.D.) of Kane County presented an award to Sgt. Rich Childs (15 arrests) and Officer Chris Solesky (6 arrests) for having the highest D.U.I. arrests for 1995. This is in recognition of all officers for the job they do and that M.A.D.D. is behind them 100% and that their job is appreciated. Thanks also go to Chief Montalbano for participating this year in the program.

ROADS & PARKS:

- 1. July 4th festivities went well this year. Clean up went rather quickly. Trustee Johnson stated that the fireworks were the best he has seen in a long while. Trustee Tennis would like to thank the Sleepy Hollow Service Club for one of the best Independence Day celebrations. Trustee Johnson stated that a letter of appreciation for a job well done should be sent to the Service Club.
- 2. Engineer Koenig put together a proposal to the Kane County Council of Mayors regarding STP funding for the possible resurfacing of Sleepy Hollow Road in the future. The request for additional funding was submitted, but this does not guarantee we will get the funds. This is for a Rustic Road application only.
- 3. Trustee Fuqua put together a bid proposal for the salt storage bin. Would like to advertise to go out for bid as soon as possible. FUQUA MOVED WITH A SECOND FROM HARNEY TO GO OUT FOR BIDS AT THE EARLIEST POSSIBLE DATE FOR A SALT STORAGE BUILDING. AYE: FUQUA, HARNEY, DeBOLT, JOHNSON, TENNIS, WILLIAMS. MOTION PASSED.

WATER:

1. We are not paying the invoice from CMT. Ellen sent a letter requesting that they submit an invoice in the form we requested in a previous meeting.

2. There was a complaint from a resident at 520 Joy Lane regarding a wet swale. It was determined that

this was not from a leaking buffalo box, but from a sump pump discharge pipe.

3. Regarding leaking hydrants, it was estimated that they were leaking one gallon per minute which equals approximately \$30 per day. The leaks were detected around April 19, 1996. There are 7 hydrants that are leaking. That comes to 1440 gallons per day per hydrant and the total comes to about 10,000 gallons per day. This information was sent to Attorney Schuster to see about reimbursement from bonding company.

3. Zoning enforcement is going well. Joel Kruse is doing some inspections with Joe Prang and everything is going well.

1. Scott and Barb Chambers of Jill Peak request some assistance in getting a building permit for changing their deck into a screened in porch. Trustee Johnson stated that building plans must be submitted, reviewed, and then a permit should be obtained. The plans that were submitted were not adequate. It was determined that Mr. Johnson would meet with Joe Prang in the morning to look into this.

2. John Kedzior shot the grades and will present his findings at the first meeting in August. He also needs

the Public Works truck for the tree limbs and brush, etc.


