PRESIDENT:

1. We have been awarded a grant from the State for \$9,000 to be used toward a speed monitoring trailer and Sleepy Hollow Road "Pleasure Drive" signs. MORRIS MOVED WITH A SECOND FROM GROM TO AUTHORIZE THE VILLAGE PRESIDENT TO SIGN AND RETURN THE GRANT AGREEMENT TO THE STATE. MOTION PASSED BY VOICE VOTE.

- 1. Chairman Art Neil said the hearing on the Michalski property should be late this month.

ATTORNEY:

1. Mr. Schuster presented two draft resolutions and discussed proposed referendum questions for the April election to increase the Sleepy Hollow portion of property taxes. We must obtain the CPI for 2002 from the Illinois Department of Revenue before we can determine the increase to the aggregate tax extension. The CPI should be available in the next couple weeks. The Village must then propose a second question to residents to increase the tax rate for a specific Village fund. Both resolutions must be enacted by the Village by January 27th and certified to the county clerk by January 30th. The resolutions will be finalized for approval at the January 20th meeting if the necessary information has been received. (Trustee Merkel arrives at 7:50 p.m.)

ENGINEER:

1. Since the Army Corp. would be against a box culvert, we will proceed with the original proposed for the bridge repairs. However, IDOT has advised Engineer Heinz that the Village must go out to bid again for this project since the completion date has expired. After discussing elimination of certain costs, the Board agreed

that the bid specs will remain the same as previously advertised. <u>GROM MOVED WITH A SECOND FROM ZIEMBA TO AUTHORIZE THE ENGINEER TO PROCEED WITH THE WORK FOR ADVERTISING THE BID SPECS. MOTION PASSED BY VOICE VOTE.</u>

DIRECTOR OF FINANCE:
