of these is the responsibility of the homeowner and without proper upkeep will impact the flow of rainwater throughout the neighboring area affecting property up stream.

The residential drainage is flowing towards either Jelke Creek or Sleepy Creek. Residents living adjacent to these water ways bear extra responsibilities as they live in the flood plain/flood way area. Activities in the flood plain/way are controlled by the U.S. Army Corp of Engineers. Building berms, piling of yard waste and putting in structures that fill in areas that are supposed to take excess rainwaters does not help up stream.

The quality of life in Sleepy Hollow is not the result of just one thing, it is sum of many. And each and every one of us that call Sleepy Hollow home share that responsibility.

Enjoy your summer and remember the 4th of July in the Hollow will be a 2-day event this year. Fireworks will be on Saturday, July 2nd with the parade and picnicking on Monday, July 4th.

VILLAGE COST SAVINGS

Last fall when Public Works began the process of replacing the aging diesel fuel storage tank, Chief Parma inquired into the possibility of having a gasoline storage tank installed also. After checking the various building code requirements and conversations with the State Fire Marshall's office, it was determined that the Village could have a gas storage tank in a safe, yet convenient place.

With the safety questions answered Chief Parma was able to arrange a deal where the old diesel tank would be removed and disposed of at no cost to the Village along with the placement of one new diesel tank and one new gasoline tank. The Village will now benefit in two ways. First, the cost of fuel, both diesel and gas, will now be at a bulk rate rather than current pump price. And secondly, the Police Officers will no longer have to leave the Village in search of gasoline saving the Village not only on the cost of fuel but also a savings of time by allowing the Officers to stay within the boundaries of the Village.

Fireworks

Since we are on the topic of unpleasant chats, let's talk about fireworks. The 4th of July is quickly approaching, and I would like to remind all residents about the rules governing fireworks. Private, unlicensed, or non-permitted fireworks are illegal under both Illinois State Law and Village of Sleepy Hollow municipal code. Someone charged with illegal possession or use of fireworks could face up to a year in jail and a \$2500 fine under state law and a fine of up to \$750 if charged with a village ordinance violation. Either way, not a good outcome. Worse than the criminal ramifications of illegal fireworks are the injuries suffered by hundreds of citizens every year. Please do not put yourself or others at risk. Instead, plan to join us for the wonderful fireworks display sponsored by the Service Club planned for July 2, 2022, at Sabatino Park. It's a much bigger, better, and far less expensive way to go!

The female stated that she was going to kill herself and began opening the door to the second-floor balcony. Believing that she intended to jump off the balcony, Officer Diori moved toward the subject and grabbed her around the upper body to prevent her from harming herself.

Officer Diori's quick and decisive actions prevented the subject from harming herself and allowed for her to be transported to the hospital for treatment. In doing so, he upheld the highest levels of police work and cast a positive light on our profession and organization.

WATER SAFETY

Not including boating incidents, about 10 people die from drowning every day in the United States, according to the Centers for Disease Control. While drowning is a risk for every age group, National Safety Council statistics point to drowning being the #1 cause of death for children ages 1-4. Deaths in this age group are mostly due to a child falling into a pool or being left alone in the bathtub.

More than 1 in 5 drowning victims are children 14 years old and younger, and most incidents happen when a child falls into a pool or is left alone in the bathtub. Keep your kids safe in the water:

- ❖ Consider enrolling children over the age of three in swimming lessons
- ❖ Don't rely on lifeguards to watch your children
- ❖ Never leave your child unattended

CELEBRATING 10 YEARS IN FULL COLOR

If you couldn't already tell by cover of this edition, 2022 marks ten years since The Legend became a color publication. What originated in the 1970s as a local newspaper took a hiatus and then returned as a black and white stapled office paper packet. In 2012, The Legend evolved once again to its current format. Through the years, The Legend has been entirely produced by volunteers and the timeline below outlines some key events that have occurred within The Legend in the last ten years.

- Summer 2012: Joy Wind produces her last edition of The Legend
- Fall 2012: Karen Kruger takes over editing duties and restyles The Legend to a 12-page color format
- Winter 2012: The first Winter edition is sent to residents. Previously, The Legend was only sent out 3 times per year (Spring, Summer, and Fall)
- Winter 2017: Karen Kruger announces she is passing off The Legend to someone else as she is moving
- Spring 2018: JP Lanz, Kathleen Eaton, and CM Parker assume editing duties and produce their first edition
- Summer 2019: JP departs from the editing team; The Legend continues to be produced by CM and Kathy
- Fall 2019: The Legend undergoes a facelift with a new font family; print production ceases making this the first edition to not be mailed to residents. A plan is put in place so residents will still receive the summer editions in the mail while Fall, Winter, and Spring will be online exclusives.
- Summer 2020: Due to the Covid-19 pandemic, The Legend is not printed; first summer edition to not be mailed
- Summer 2021: The Service Club assists with costs so this edition of The Legend can be mailed to residents; a newsletter improvement survey is released asking for residents' feedback on the newsletter
- Spring 2022: The Village investigates the possibility of a subscription service so interested residents can receive Fall, Winter, and Spring editions of The Legend by mail

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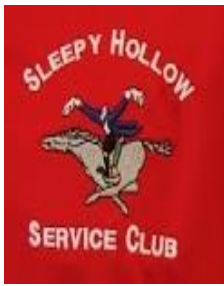

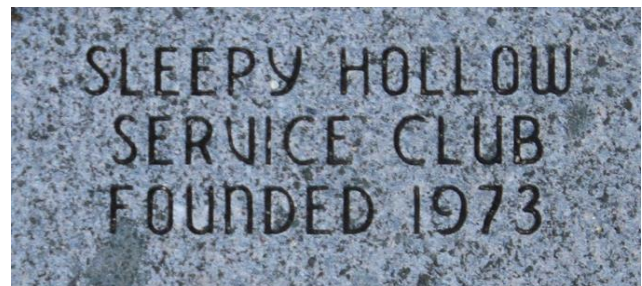


Old Street Sign Auction

This year's soaring gas prices may have many reconsidering the comforts and amenities—and entertainment—available in their very own homes. As an alternative to vacations or weekend getaways, some homeowners may decide to make improvements to their homes, such as remodeling a basement into a game/recreation or theater room, adding a sunroom, screened porch, or outdoor venue such as a deck, swimming pool, or perhaps a built-in cooking area.

If one of these projects is on your planning list, here is a list of the items you will need to bring with your completed permit application.



- ✓ Two complete set of plans. These plans should include the structural drawings, and any electrical, mechanical (heating/air conditioning), or plumbing changes to be done.
- ✓ A list of the contractors doing the work, if you, the homeowner, are not doing the work; and
- ✓ A copy of your plat of survey showing the exact location of any new exterior construction. This needs to be drawn to scale and be sure to show the distances from any lot line to the new project. (A plat is not needed for interior work.)

On another subject--septic and well issues are a concern to many residents. If you have any questions about your system or needed repairs/replacement, please contact the Kane County Health Department/Environmental, 1750 Grandstand Place, Elgin. A LETTER TO THE EDITORS

As a resident of the Village of Sleepy Hollow for the past 34 years, I would like to make my fellow residents aware of some items that need our attention. Sleepy Hollow has been a wonderful and safe place to raise our family, and we have enjoyed all that our unique Village has to offer. With that being said, there are some very near-term things that need to be addressed to maintain the unique character and safety of Sleepy Hollow:

Sabatino Park Playground

Sabatino Park Playground is over 20 years old. It is currently being inspected/maintained by the Dundee Park District, but the playground is owned by the Village of Sleepy Hollow. Any repairs are the responsibility of the Village of Sleepy Hollow. Based on its current condition, the playground will need to be replaced within the next 1 – 2 years. The cost for this could potentially be over \$200,000, and the Village does not have enough funds set aside to cover this large of an expense. With that being said, We, as a Village, need to come together and either (1) get volunteers to work on getting grants, or (2) if you have experience working on Grants, please let us know if you are willing to assist, or (3) put together a fundraiser specifically for the purpose of generating Playground Funds, or (4) Vote Yes to pass a dedicated referendum for an increase in our taxes to cover the cost of the playground replacement.



Road Safety

A small group of residents have been working together with the Village of Sleepy Hollow Board, and our Police Chief, to work on ideas to help curb the excessive speeding throughout the Village. This is an ongoing issue but, again, we need to work together to fix the issue. The maximum speed limit within the Village is 25 MPH, yet drivers routinely travel at speeds far in excess of that, and with little regard for the pedestrians, or wildlife, who are present on the same roads, and have the right of way. Incremental progress has been made to help minimize non-resident traffic, for example removing Village of Sleepy Hollow from GPS/road congestion apps like Google Maps and Waze, where their software had previously diverted traffic through our Village when larger, external roads were congested. Route 31 being congested at 72, so redirecting traffic at 31 and Willow onto Willow, was common practice by these companies' software in the past. Other examples are at Randall and Joy when Randall at 72 was backed-up, or at Locust and 72 when 72 was backed up at 31. This has been stopped through our efforts. While this helps with the volume of traffic, and potentially from drivers who are non-resident, as a Village we still need all residents to participate in SLOWING DOWN!

You may have noticed the \$5.00 increase in Village Vehicle Stickers this year. The Village Board approved the increase to create funds dedicated to fund traffic safety programs (Purchasing/Installing Portable Speed Monitoring Devices, LED lights on stop signs and additional speed signs) throughout the Village to make drivers aware when speeding to please SLOW DOWN.

Police Body Cameras

The police department is in need of Car/Body Cams. They will need to be utilized by all Illinois Police officers by 2025. This is part of the SAFE-T Act, signed into Law in Feb 2021. Village of Sleepy Hollow Police officers are here for our safety, and we as residents should consider creating a separate fund-raising event to help offset the cost to the Village, or VOTE YES if this is put on a future referendum. We all benefit from this directly.

Lake Sharon Restoration

Lake Sharon has, for the majority of Sleepy Hollow's existence, been a community asset, a place where families could fish, watch wildlife, picnic and play. It has not aged well and has become both a health hazard, and also a safety concern. A group of residents have been working with Kane County, the Army Corps of Engineers, as well as environmental groups like the Friends of the Fox to help clean up Lake Sharon/preserve its deterioration, shores and dam, as well as restoring other streams/ponds throughout the village, and bring Lake Sharon back to a safe, and enjoyable part of our community. Unfortunately, this is a large and costly project (dredging, establishing plant buffers on shorelines and rebuilding shorelines) which will only last for a few years before having to do this again. YES, it takes \$\$\$ to get this done. If you have experience, either with obtaining grants, or having worked on projects like this before, please let the Village know so that we can all work together to try to find a more viable fix that will last for our community.



In Closing

Our Village Board has done a good job of managing the Village finances with the very minimal resources they have available, but without additional funds some of the projects will not get taken care of and we will all be the worse for that.

Also, the Village Board is going to begin mailing out The Legend again to those residents that prefer to have it mailed, versus reading it online. If you prefer a mailed version, please notify the Village Clerk with your address so that you can receive a copy. Also, you will also be able to pick up a copy of The Legend at the Village Hall when you pay your water bill/stop in for other Village business. In closing, we, as residents, need to increase our awareness of the issues in the Village and what we can individually, as well as collectively, do to help. If you can, also please volunteer your experience/time, either for the issues I've touched on here, or something else you'd be glad to give your time to. Please also attend the regular Village Board Meetings at the Village Hall, or via computer if you prefer, so you know what business is in front of the Board. Our Board of Trustees are making decisions that affect you, and your home ownership, at each of these meetings. This is your forum to express concerns as a resident, or share good things, too. Lend your voice so this community continues to be the safe, enjoyable, and enviable place we all want it to be. Thank you.

THE VICTORIAN REVIVAL ABODE FROM SPRING

The house featured in our spring contest is located at 404 Arabian Parkway. This unique Village home is the only Equestrian model to be built with the Victorian exterior to have a left-hand garage placement, as well as a side-loading garage. Through the years, the house has undergone cosmetic changes to its exterior, losing the signature half-round typons and hardboard cladding as well as seeing a side addition that added a small porch and third bay to the garage. Only four Victorian Equestrians were built, and each one is unique to the Village's housing stock. 407 Arabian is the only one to have two fireplaces, 510 Belmont is the only one to have the standard (front suite) layout, and 706 Pimlico is unique since it has the optional (rear suite) layout, one fireplace, and front-loading right-hand garage placement.

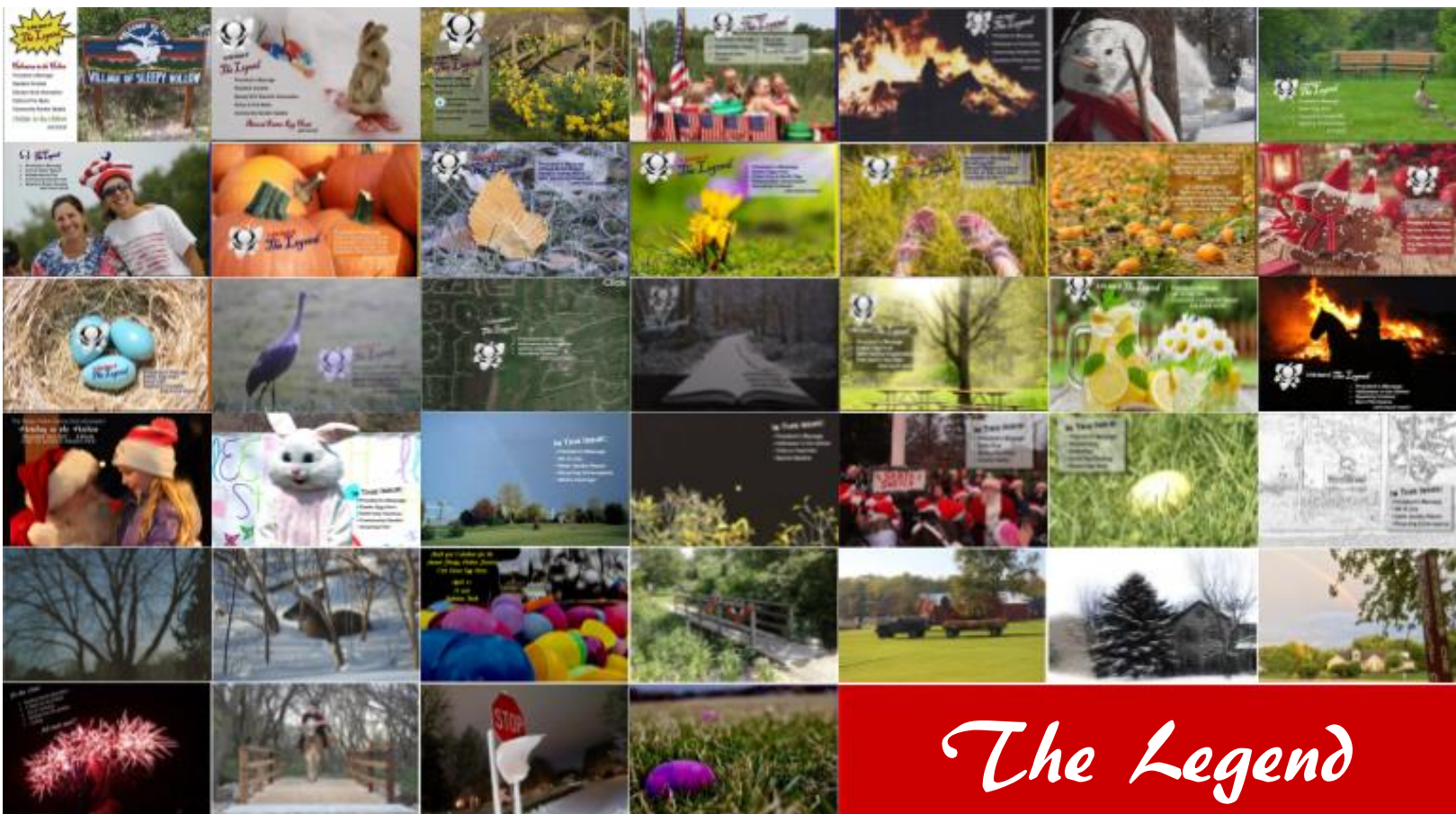
