President Peterson called to order the regular meeting of the Sleepy Hollow Corp. Authorities at 7:37 p.m. Roll call: Peterson, Milz, Mountjoy, Roberts, Thomas, also Deputy Clerk Tobin, Treas. Scott, Chief Bradley. Grisolia and Zhe absent.

Mr. Roberts moved to accept minutes of the previous meeting, seconded by Mr. Mountjoy, passed by voice vote.

Treas. Report: General bills - \$5,311.79, receipts \$20,465.49. Mr. Thomas moved to accept Treas. report and pay the bills, seconded by Mr. Roberts. Roll call: Milz, Mountjoy, Roberts, Thomas aye. 2 absent.

Water Dept.: Bills - \$1,239.67, receipts \$8,348.96. Mr. Thomas moved to accept Treas. report and pay the bills, seconded by Mr. Roberts. Roll call: Milz, Mountjoy, Roberts, Thomas aye. 2 absent.

President Peterson report:

Walt Heffron of ZBA will proceed with consideration of amendments of Zoning Ord. re: windmills, solar houses, commercial trucks - will come to the board with review before any changes.

Chief Bradley is handling letter received from Mr. Bauman's attorney regarding a resident of the village parking a truck in Walnut Hill. He has talked to the individual who is trying to locate another area for parking his equipment.

Mrs Peterson indicated she had been contacted by the county for a public hearing (scheduled for April 13, will have to be rescheduled) regarding the up-dated flood plain map for this area.

Mr. Mountjoy gave Mr. Milz an estimate for a roof on the salt bins There is also a crack in the rear wall of one bin which will have to be fixed.

Mr. Mountjoy will talk to Mr. Hults about plantings in the new areas around village hall.

Mr. Thomas indicated he wanted the reports from each trustee in the next few days for the preparation of the administration budget meeting.

Mr. Milz reported the fire department had checked all the fire hydrants. Arnold Ross of the water department had talked to the chief and was advised there are 8 hydrants needing replacement. (7 bad and one missing). Mr. Ross has an estimate of \$785. for a 6 inch main and \$745. for 4 inch main. Mr. Milz will check on specifications and made motion that when this information is complete that we advertise for bids on fire hydrant replacements. Seconded by Mr. Thomas. Passed by voice vote.

Meeting opened to public.

Mr. Denny Euers, president of Sleepy Hollow Service Club, asked for four permits covering their 4th of July activities. They are as follows: 1) raffle 2) fire works display 3) solicitation permit for the gates 4) Beer on 4th or first day following in case of rain. Mr. Thomas made motion to grant permits subject to Attorney's approval on raffle. Seconded by Mr. Milz. Passed by voice vote.

Mr. John Bohanek questioned what is being done regarding the creek situation behind his home which developed with the grading of the Homart property. Mr. Thomas will follow up on this.

Mr. Bohanek was also upset that he still has not had any relief on the water service problem to his home. Mr. Thomas will check with the engineer to see if a yard hydrant and holding tank might solve the problem.

Mr. Milz stated there is a State Law that flouride has to be put in the water system. Instructed Mr. Ross to discuss the proper way of handling this with our engineer.

On further water company business Mr. Ross has an estimate of \$475. for a 12 by 12 foot slab to be placed next to the building for the placement of the emergency generator. Mr. Roberts made a motion to proceed with a limit of \$550. for the pad. Seconded by Mr. Milz. Roll call: Milz, Mountjoy, Roberts, Thomas aye. 2 absent.

Mr. Roberts discussed the location of the storage barn for the Sleepy Hollow Service Club. It will probably go on the north side of the building - plans will be forthcoming.

Mr. Roberts moved to adjourn. Seconded by Mountjoy.
