

MINUTES OF THE BOARD MEETING  
 VILLAGE OF SLEEPY HOLLOW  
 JUNE 7th, 1965

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 PM by Floyd Falese, Village President. Roll call was taken and answered as follows:

L. Knott - present	F. Cramer - present

Jerome Kessler, Village Clerk read the minutes. Mr. Cramer moved and Mr. Knott seconded the motion for acceptance of the minutes as read. The motion was unanimous. A report was given on the repair of the bridge undertaken by the Park Commission. The entire Board wish to go on record as expressing their thanks to the Park Commission for the excellent job that resulted from their efforts. This represented many hours of hard work and the excellence of the results were well noted.

A report on road work was made by Mr. Falese. He stated that Unit 12 was well underway as far as surfacing. A problem was noted, however, as to the setting of culverts in the road. Some delay was being met as the result of residents improperly placing their culverts. The Village has an ordinance in regard to the setting of culverts, The Chief of Police was instructed to make sure that proper enforcement of this was met. He was specifically instructed to tell those residents who are in violation that they will have ten days notice for the purpose of complying with the ordinance.

Ordinance 65-2 was read by Mr. Fischer which provided for the adjusting of the Village of Sleepy Hollow curfew hours to be in conformity with the neighboring communities. Mr. Fischer moved and Mr. Knott seconded that the ordinance be accepted and it was unanimous.


Mr. Fischer reported on the need for the Police Department to have some additional supplies. Mr. Fischer moved the acceptance of the requested supplies and Mr. Cramer seconded the motion and it was unanimous. Chief Sabatino reported on the possibility of a caution light to be erected on Route 72 and Sleepy Hollow road.

Mr. Cramer asked that consideration be made to a recommendation of his own that the Park Commission take on the added duties of the planning committee. After discussion Mr. Cramer moved that the planning committee activities be made a part of the responsibilities of the Park Committee, pending the resignations of the existing planning committee members. Mr. Fischer seconded the motion and it was unanimous. Mr. Cramer further discussed with the Board a proposed ordinance on animals. This proposed ordinance was turned over to the Park Commission with a request by Mr. Cramer that they have a reply on its content by the next meeting.

Mr. Spiro spoke from the floor requesting permission to erect a forty foot tower by his home. Mr. Spiro was represented by Attorney Brittan. Mr. Fischer moved that the building inspector be authorized of the erection of this tower at a height not to exceed forty feet. A fee of \$10.00 was being charged. Mr. Tessororf seconded the motion and it was unanimous.

Mr. Hlavacek reported on the need for posts for stop signs. He indicated that he was able to get them. Mr. Hlavacek on behalf of the Park and Safety Committee offered the availability of services if needed for the fourth of July fireworks display. Mr. Tessororf moved and Mr. Cramer seconded that the meeting be adjourned.
